Offensive

Carla Binnewies, Sr., Mid.
Longwood (Hamburg, Germany)

Binnewies recorded her first hat trick of the season in a 5-2 conference victory over Davidson. She scored the first goal of the match and with two seconds remain in the first half, she put the Lancers up for good with a penalty corner goal. Her third tally of the night gave Longwood a three-goal cushion.

Co-Defensive

Katie Knoche, Sr., Goalkeeper
California (San Diego, Calif.)

Knoche played a key part in California's come-from-behind penalty stroke victory over then No. 19 Albany. She made seven saves through the 100 minutes of field play and was even bigger in strokes. Knoche stopped three Albany attempts, allowing the Bears to edge the Great Danes, 3-2.

Alessandra Moss, R-Fr., Goalkeeper
Stanford (New York, N.Y.)

Moss recorded 17 saves in a pair of matches for the Cardinal. In a match against then No. 4 Iowa, she recorded a career high 13 saves keeping Stanford within striking distance. Those saves are tied for the sixth most in a Division I match in 2008.

Rookie

Stephanie Byrne, Fr., For.
Stanford (San Jose, Calif.)

Byrne found the back of the cage twice in a one-goal setback against No. 4 Iowa and led the Cardinal with a team best three shots. This season Byrne, who has done all her scoring against nationally ranked Big Ten opponents, is tied for the NorPac lead with four goals.

2008 NEWS AND NOTES

Around the NorPac

Appalachian State

Amanda Young continues to find the back of the cage for the Mountaineers. She tallied her team best fourth goal which also ties her for NorPac lead.

The Mountaineers suffered a pair of tough 3-2 losses in Pennsylvania last weekend. ASU is looking to rebound when it hosts Stanford in their home opener on Thursday. They will then head down to Durham, N.C. to face off against No. 18 Ohio State.

California

Cal used a late rally to upend then No. 19 Albany last week. The Bears rallied from a 2-0 deficit, sending the match into overtime on a goal with just seven seconds left in regulation. They would go on and win in penalty strokes.

The win propelled the Bears into the 19th spot of this week's STX/NFHCA Coaches Poll.

Davidson

Davidson looks to rebound after a pair of defeats last week. The Wildcats will host Longwood in a rematch of last week's NorPac matchup. Also, top-ranked Wake Forest will make the trek to Davidson on Sunday.

Longwood

The Lancers earned a pair of wins at home last week. Longwood used four straight goals to defeat Davidson in a NorPac clash. They followed that by erasing a 2-0 deficit and defeating Towson, 3-2. All three goals came within a 10-minute span.

Carla Binnewies recorded her first hat trick of the season against the Wildcats.

Pacific

Pacific ended their Ohio trip on a high note, blanking Robert Morris, 3-0, to pick up its first win of the season.

Katy McDonough registered a goal, the eventual game-winner, and an assist against the Colonials.

Radford

Radford recorded a pair of 3-0 shutouts to earn its first two victories of the season in a trip to Pennsylvania. Along with the stellar defense, six different Highlanders scored a goal over the weekend with freshman **Madonna**

Wadolowski scoring her first collegiate goal at Robert Morris.

Stanford

The Cardinal ended a very tough season-opening schedule with another nailbiting one-goal loss to then No. 19 Albany, 1-0. It marked the first 1-0 loss at home since 2002.

It was third match this season decided by one goal. In its first six matches, Stanford has played four nationally-ranked opponents.
