Around the NorPac

Appalachian State

The Mountaineers host Catawba in their lone match of the week.

California

The Bears remain ranked 14th in the NFHCA rankings. Senior Valentina Godfrid ranks sixth in both goals per game and points per game. After they conclude their trip at Louisville, Cal returns home to host Davidson on Sunday

Davidson

Sophomore Brittany Rollek is ranked 17th in save percentage and 30th in the NCAA in saves.

Sophomore Lauren Calve came off the bench and recorded her first collegiate hat trick with three consecutive goals against Catawba. In one match, she surpassed her goal total (2) of last season. Sophomore Sarah Addison recorded her first career goal against Catawba.

The Tigers have recorded 13 defensive saves with nine by Jen Willis, both Conference highs.

Longwood

Goalkeeper Erin West ranks nationally in saves per game.

The Lancers return to League play on Sunday when they host Pacific.

Pacific

Senior Vianny Campos, the No. 3 goal scorer in the NCAA, has tallied five of the Tigers' six game-winning goals this year, after netting one at Stanford last week.

The Tigers head East for three games. After Thursday matchup at No. 9 Virginia, Pacific will face Radford and Longwood on the weekend with both games in Farmville.

Radford

Radford will face its third straight ranked opponent on the road when it travels to No. 2 Wake Forest on Wednesday. They will then head to Farmville to face Conference foe Pacific on Saturday.
