Around the NorPac

Appalachian State
The Mountaineers will take on Boston University at Duke on Saturday.

California
The Bears jumped into the NFHCA rankings at No. 16 after a 4-1 start which included a victory over then No. 6 American.

Valentina Godfrid has scored in four of Cal's first five matches and is tied for the Conference lead with seven. The Bears are averaging 3.0 goals per game. Cal will host rival Stanford in a non-conference match on Saturday.

Davidson
The Tigers were the last NorPac school to get started. They began their 2006 season 1-1, falling to William and Mary, before rebounding with a win over Christopher Newport.

Davidson will head to green mountains of Vermont to take on New Hampshire and Vermont this weekend.

Longwood
In the first NorPac match of 2006, the Lancers opened up Conference play with a 5-1 victory over Appalachian State. Longwood heads to Pennsylvania this weekend to face Lock Haven and Bucknell.

Pacific
Vianney Campos has started strong scoring seven goals in five games. She started last season scoring seven goals in her first six games.

The Tigers make their way to Indiana and Ohio for three matches, starting Thursday at Ball State. They then meet up with former NorPac foe Saint Louis in Muncie and wrap up the trip at No. 6 Ohio State.

Radford
Radford started the season 2-0 for the first time since 1996 with a pair of victories in its season-opening trip to New York.

Senior Tiffany Church, coming off an 11-assist 2005 campaign, recorded an assist against Siena, moving her into a tie for fourth on RU's career assist charts with 14.

Radford will face a pair of nationally ranked team this week. On Wednesday, they head to No. 11 Virginia and this weekend they go to Ohio University to face No. 15 Indiana, along with the host Bobcats.

Stanford
The Cardinal enjoyed their biggest offensive output of the season in a 5-1 victory over Columbia. They also outshot the Lions, 31-6.

Three Cardinal are tied with a team best three goals this season. Stanford and Cal will hook up in a non-conference match on Saturday.
