NorPac News

A Trip Around the NorPac

Oct. 7- Oct. 20 Recap: Once again, conference play did not disappoint as five of six matchups were decided by one goal, with the other one being a two-goal difference. Cal remained undefeated in the west with a 2-1 win over Stanford in Berkeley and Radford moved into a first place tie with Davidson in the east after shutting out Appalachian State, 1-0 in Boone.

Other east action included SMS sweeping a pair at home from the Mountaineers. Those wins extended their home winning streak to nine games. Prior to that, they hung tough with then 14th ranked Iowa, falling 1-0. In other nonconference action, the Highlanders picked up a non-conference win, 1-0, over Villanova before dropping a 2-0 match to then #10 Duke. Despite dropping three matches, Davidson's keeper Sarah Nolan posted 46 total saves including 25 and 15 against then #4 Wake Forest and top-ranked Maryland.

Out west, Stanford completed their sweep of Saint Louis, with a 4-3 nailbiter on the road. Pacific earned their first conference win of the season, downing the Billikens 2-0, snapping an 11-match losing streak in the process.


The Weeks Ahead: With only two weeks left in the regular season, the race for first place in each division is still up for grabs. In the west, #20 Cal holds a slim half-game lead on Stanford, while Davidson and Radford are tied atop the east with SMS sitting behind a half-game as well.

The Cardinal and Bears meet in the final NorPac match of the season on Nov. 2nd at Stanford. It is the only match left for the 4-1 Cardinal, while Cal must face Saint Louis and Pacific at home next week before their matchup.


In the east, Davidson and Radford meet on Saturday in what could be a matchup for first. The Wildcats must first contend with Appalachian State on Wednesday before heading to Radford. The Highlanders also face #8 James Madison and close out the season against #18 Boston College. Finished with conference play, SMS will wrap up their season with a pair of games in Athens, Ohio against #13 Kent State and host Ohio University before heading home for a meeting with Saint Louis on Nov. 3.

Stanford University will be the host for the 2002 NorPac Tournament Nov. 7-9 in Stanford, Calif.






Appalachian State — Will close out their regular season with three home games, including a conference matchup on Oct. 23 against Davidson.








Saint Louis — The Billikens wrap up their 6-game road trip this week, before heading home for their final home game against Lindenwood on Oct. 30.
