A Trip Around the NorPac

Oct. 21- Nov. 3 Recap: Another exciting regular season in the NorPac has concluded with defending champion California and Radford, in their sophomore season, claiming the West and East Division titles. Both teams pulled out one-goal victories in their final conference matches of the season.

The Bears, on a goal from Nora Feddersen, downed Stanford 2-1 in overtime to finish the season with an undefeated 6-0 record in conference play and the #1 seed in the West for the second consecutive season. An early goal by Erin Hebert held up as the Highlanders blanked Davidson, 1-0, finishing one game ahead of SMS at 4-1 and giving them their first division title.

SMS and Appalachian State ended their regular seasons on a high note, picking up home victories before heading to Stanford. The Bears downed Saint Louis 3-2, extending their home winning streak to 10 matches. The Mountaineers shutout Longwood, 1-0 with freshman Kate Ryno picking up her first career shutout.

The Weeks Ahead: The 2002 NorPac Championship will begin on Thursday. The Bears, who claimed the West Division title and will be the top seed for the second consecutive year, will take on the fourth seed out of the east, Appalachian State (1-5) at 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, Nov. 7. While the Highlanders, in only their second season in the Conference, will face the fourth seed out of the west, Saint Louis (0-6) at 1:00 p.m. on Nov. 7. Host Stanford (4-2) claimed the second seed in the west for the second consecutive season. The Cardinal will face the third seed in the east, Davidson (3-3) at 3:00 p.m. on Nov. 7. Last season's East Division champion, Southwest Missouri State (3-2) will be the second seed in the east and will take on the third seed in the west, Pacific (2-4) at 9:00 a.m. on Nov. 7.


The semifinal games will be at 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 8, while the consolation games will also be played on that day at 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. The Championship match will be played on Saturday, Nov. 9 at 12:30 p.m., while the third-place match will be held prior to that at 10:00 a.m.

The tournament champion will face its counterpart from the Patriot League in a play-in game on Nov. 12 at the site of the NorPac champion.


Stanford Hosts 2002 NorPac Championships

Stanford University will be the host for the 2002 NorPac Tournament Nov. 7-9 in Stanford, Calif.




California — The Bears rebounded from season-high three-game losing streak with three consecutive wins to close out their regular season ... Nora Feddersen tied her career high with 26 points this season




Appalachian State — The Mountaineers will face California in the first round of the tournament. They last met in 1998, falling 3-1 to the Bears.









Radford — With their 1-0 loss to #15 Boston College, half of the Highlanders 10 losses this season have been by one goal ... With their 4-0 shutout over LaSalle, the Highlanders match their highest total of shutouts since 1996 when they also had six.
