Appalachian State

Brookes named to NFCHA All-Region Team - Senior Nara Brookes has been named to National Field Hockey Coaches' Association (NFCHA) second-team all-South Region. Brookes was also named the 2003 NorPac East Division Player of the Year and has also been named to the NorPac All-Tournament team and selected to participate in the annual NFCHA Division I North/South All-Star Game Saturday in Amherst, Mass.

California

Bears upset Richmond en route to NCAA's After winning their third consecutive NorPac Tournament, California upset 12th-ranked Richmond (2-1) in the play-in-game to advance to their third consecutive NCAA tournament. The Bears fell to #3 Maryland (2-0) in the opening round.

Feddersen named to NFCHA All-Region Team - Senior Nora Feddersen has been named to National Field Hockey Coaches' Association (NFCHA) first-team All-West Region. Feddersen was also named the 2003 NorPac West Division Player of the Year.

Davidson

Nolan Named East Defensive Player of the Year - Nolan set a school record for saves this season with 190, a mark that ranks her third in the nation in that category. She posted four shutouts during a seven-game win-streak in the middle of the season, Davidson's longest streak in almost 11 years..

Pacific

Tigers equal school record with nine wins With a 3-0 victory over Davidson in the consolation bracket of the NorPac Tournament the Pacific Tigers equalled a school record with nine victories on the season.

Campos and Kato collect postseason awards - Senior Cameron Kato and freshman Vianney Campos were named West Defensive and Offensive Player of Year. Campos also earned a spot on the NFCHA All-Region second team, while Kato was selected to participate in the annual NFCHA Division I North/South All-Star Game.

Radford

Highlanders advance to first ever NorPac Tournament Final - The number three seed from the East Division, Radford made an impressive run to the NorPac Tournament Championship game with back-to-back victories over Pacific (1-0, PS) and SMS (2-1), before falling to Cal (5-2) in the final.

Saint Louis

Inspired Host of the NorPac Tournament - Despite two losses in the NorPac Tournament, the Billikens provided some of the most competitive hockey of their season, falling 2-1 to eventual champion Cal and 5-4 to ASU.

SMS

Bears upset Davidson - The fourth seed from the West Division, SMS upset East top seed Davidson 1-0 in the opening round of the NorPac Tournament.

Stanford

Nor Dawood ends career with a win - Senior Nor Dawood ended her Cardinal career with the game winning goal in Stanford's 2-1 (2OT) win over SMS to claim third place at the NorPac Tournament.
