2007 NEWS AND NOTES

Around the NorPac

Appalachian State

Jessie Harris scored recorded a hat trick, tallying all three goals in the Mountaineers' match at Longwood. Keeper Denise Adams recorded 17 saves against then No 5 Wake Forest last week, her second highest total of the season (19 vs. No. 1 North Carolina).

California

Cal had its seven-game winning streak snapped at No. 19 Virginia last week. The Bears three losses this season have been at the hands of nationally ranked opponents, posted a 2-3 record against top-20 teams. Redshirt freshman Kaitlin Duncan recorded her first collegiate point with an assist against VCU. Carolina Bistue registered her career high fourth assist against VCU. Davidson

The Wildcats head north to New Hampshire for their next three matches. They will play all three at Dartmouth College, facing off against UNH, Maine and the Big Green.

Longwood

The Lancers had recorded a season-long three-game winning streak snapped on Sunday vs. Pacific. They have a tough three-game stretch coming up, facing top-20 opponents, Duke, James Madison and Virginia. The home match vs. JMU will be the first time the Lancers have hosted the Dukes.

Pacific

This week, Pacific will make its second trip East. The Tigers will face off against three NorPac teams in four days, starting Thursday and ending Sunday. All matches are at Longwood.

Radford

Radford recorded back-to-back shutouts for the first time this season when it blanked Pacific in overtime last Thursday. Freshman keeper Jennifer Wisniewski recorded 14 saves in the two matches, the other coming against Appalachian State.

The overtime win over Pacific marked the fifth straight one-goal game between the teams and the sixth in seven total matches. It was also the second straight overtime match and the fourth in five matches.

Stanford

Stanford returns to action on Saturday, hosting Northwestern, followed by No. 3 Wake Forest on Monday.
