Offensive

Stephanie McLamb, Sr., Mid.
Radford (Gloucester, Va.)

McLamb tallied a goal and two assists in a pair of victories over Davidson and Longwood. She scored her team-best sixth goal of the season and assisted on Radford's first goal of the match which proved to be the game-winner.

Against Longwood, she assisted on Radford's lone goal in regulation and then scored the clinching stroke in a 2-1 conference win.

Defensive

Erin West, Sr., GK
Longwood (Stafford, Va.)

West turned in the top NCAA performance of the season so far, making 25 saves in a tough penalty stroke defeat at Radford. She allowed just one Highlander goal in regulation and also made three more saves in the shootout.

Earlier in the week against then No. 1 Wake Forest, West held her own making nine saves bringing her two-game total for the week to 34.

Rookie

Marlee Schramm, Fr., Back
Radford (Mantua, N.J.)

Schramm was part of a Radford defense that allowed just seven shots in 170 minutes of action in wins against Davidson and Longwood. On Saturday, she helped hold the Wildcats to four shots as the Highlanders recorded their fifth shutout of the season.

The following day against the Lancers, her play on defense limited Longwood to just three shots. She was also the only Highlander to convert both her strokes, keying them to a 4-3 shootout win.

2008 NEWS AND NOTES

Around the NorPac

Appalachian State

The Mountaineers won back-to-back games including a conference victory over Davidson in penalty strokes. Appalachian State heads to Radford on Saturday for a NorPac tilt.

California

Cal recorded its fourth shutout of the season, defeating Pacific in a conference tilt last week. The Bears jumped up a spot to 14th in the NFHCA rankings this week.

Cal ranks in the top 10 nationally in a total of eight offensive and defensive categories which includes fourth in penalty corners and fifth in assists and goals against average.

Davidson

Davidson will travel across the country to the west coast for three NorPac games against California, Pacific and Stanford.

Longwood

Senior **Carla Binnewies** tallied a goal against then No. 1 Wake Forest to bring her league-best total to nine goals and 19 points. The Lancers hosts VCU on Saturday in their lone match of the week.

Pacific

The Tigers will take on Davidson at California in their lone match of the week.

Radford

Radford opened up its home season with a pair of victories over Davidson and Longwood. Against the Wildcats, the Highlanders scored a season high five goals and recorded their fifth shutout of the season. A day later, Radford registered a season-best 32 shots versus Longwood.

The Highlanders are tied for the second most shutouts in the NCAA with five. Senior **Stephanie McLamb** moved into Radford's top 10 in goals (17), assists (11) and points (45).

Stanford

Stanford returns home from its two-game east coast trip to Massachusetts and will return to action next Tuesday, when it hosts Davidson in a NorPac matchup.
