### PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

#### Offensive

**Katy McDonough, Jr., For.**  
**Pacific (Ventura, Calif.)**

McDonough was the driving force on offense in Pacific's three-game NorPac sweep last week. Scoring a point in each game, she notched the first goal in a 3-0 win over Appalachian State. Against Radford, she assisted on the game-tying goal. In her final game, she was instrumental in all three goals, scoring one and dishing out two assists in a 3-2 win over Longwood.

#### Defensive

**Kelly Miller, Sr., GK**  
**Pacific (Monterey, Calif.)**

Making her first three starts of the season, during the Tigers' trip to Boone, N.C., she was key in their three-game sweep.

She started the trip with four-save shutout against the host Mountaineers. Against Radford, Miller posted six saves, including two critical saves late in the second half of a 2-1 win. In the finale against Longwood, she made a season-high nine saves, facing 17 shots and 10 penalty corners in a 3-2 victory.

#### Rookie

**Niamh Connolly, Fr., For.**  
**Radford (Fredericksburg, Va.)**

Making her first two collegiate starts, Connolly scored two goals last week against Pacific and Bryant.

In her starting debut, she put Radford on the board first against Pacific and generated three shots in the game. The following day versus Bryant, she scored the Highlanders' second goal in a 3-0 triumph against Bryant.

# 2008 NEWS AND NOTES

## Around the NorPac

### Appalachian State

The Mountaineers hit the road for a pair of matches at Davidson and No. 4 Duke.

Freshman keeper **Bridgette Street** recorded 17 more saves last week with nine against Longwood and eight against Pacific. In her last three matches, Street has made 26 saves.

### California

Cal remains at No. 15 after going 2-1 on its final regular season cross-country trip. The Bears knocked off Old Dominion and Delaware, before having their five-game winning streak snapped at then No. 3 Wake Forest, 1-0.

**Kelly Knoche** recorded 12 saves in the three games, including a five-save shutout vs. Delaware and six at Wake Forest.

### Davidson

Against Bryant, freshman **Hannah English** recorded her first two collegiate goals and sophomore **Ellie Szykowny** registered her first collegiate multi-goal game with a pair.

Davidson snapped a six-game skid with its 7-1 victory over Bryant. The seven goals were a season high for the Wildcats.

### Longwood

Junior **Jessie Mantel** made her first goal of the season count, scoring the game-winner in the 68th minute at Appalachian State. She carried the momentum into the Pacific match, scoring her second goal of the season.

### Pacific

Coming off a 3-0 trip to Boone, N.C., Pacific extended its winning streak to four games, the longest streak since 2006. Both winning streaks came against Davidson, Radford, Appalachian State and Longwood.

Senior keeper **Kelly Miller** has appeared in four games this season, all four have been Pacific victories. Junior **Katy McDonough** is on a tear, amassing 12 points over the past four games.

### Radford

With its shutout of Bryant, Radford has recorded six on the season, the most since it had eight in 2002.

With three assists in the past two games, sophomore **Lara Cariker** upped her team best total to six.

### Stanford

Two days after leading the USA U-21 National Team to a gold medal at the 2008 Junior Pan American Games in Mexico city, sophomore **Camille Ghandi** increased her team lead in assists to seven.

Three different players scored and eight different players registered a shot against Davidson.

Stanford has posted back-to-back shutouts over its last two home games, outscoring its opponents 10-0.
