## **Godfrid, Campos, Bell and Muhl Earn Weekly NorPac Awards**

**RADFORD, Va.** – California's **Valentina Godfrid (Rosario, Argentina)** and Pacific's **Vianney Campos (Guadalajara, Mexico)** were named NorPac Co-Offensive Players of the Week, while Stanford's **Madison Bell (Worthington, Ohio)** and Pacific's **Lisa Muhl (Harleysville, Pa.)** earned Defensive Player and Rookie of the Week honors respectively.

Godfrid and Campos combined for eight goals in three games last week. Godfrid posted a pair of two-goal games. She started her season off helping the Bears to a 4-3 upset win in penalty strokes against No. 5 American. Her second goal with just over five minutes remaining sent the game into overtime. She followed that up by scoring the first two goals in a 3-0 victory over UMass.

Campos led Pacific to a 4-3 overtime upset of No. 5 American, tallying all four goals with included the game-winner 11:52 into overtime. She also erased a 2-0 American lead with three-straight goals, two just before the half and one with 29 seconds left in the match.

Bell helped the Cardinal go 1-1 last weekend, making a total of 14 saves against UMass and top-ranked and defending champion Maryland. Against the Terps, she made a career high 11 stops, four more than her previous high.

Muhl started her first two games of her collegiate career last week. In her first start, she had a defensive save against top-ranked Maryland. In the Tigers' upset of American, she set up Campos' first goal, notching her first collegiate point.

The NorPac had a pretty successful weekend to go along with Cal (2-0) and Pacific (1-1) upsetting No. 5 American. Cal and Stanford (1-1) defeated UMass and Radford went 2-0 with road victories over Patriot League opponents Siena and Colgate. For the week, NorPac teams went 6-5 which included five matches (2-3) against top-10 opponents, including defending champion Maryland.

The NorPac opener and matches against three ranked opponents highlight this week's Conference schedule. Longwood will host Appalachian State in the first NorPac match of the year on Sept. 2. Cal hosts defending champion Maryland and Stanford entertains No. 5 American on Tuesday. Also, second-ranked Wake Forest will head out west this week to face both the Cardinal and the Tigers. Davidson, the lone League member not open last week, will open its 2006 season on Friday, Sept. 1 at William & Mary.
