2006 NEWS AND NOTES

Around the NorPac

Appalachian State

The Mountaineers will be the sixth seed and face third-seeded Pacific in the first round of the NorPac Tournament.

California

Cal claimed its eighth consecutive regular season NorPac championship. The Bears finished the season with a perfect 6-0 record, their first since 2003.

Davidson

The Wildcats tied for fourth in the NorPac with Radford and won the tiebreaker to be the fourth seed by virtue of their victory over the Highlanders earlier this season.

Longwood

The Lancers split in their final week of play, falling to Radford and winning their senior day game against Davidson. Longwood will become a full member of Division 1 next year and be eligible for the NorPac Tournament in 2007.

Pacific

Pacific will be the three seed at the NorPac Tournament. They will face No. 6 Appalachian State in the first round. The Tigers have played for the Championship the last two years, winning in 2004.

Radford

Radford will be the fifth seed and face fourth-seeded Davidson. The teams tied for fourth with 2-4 records, but the Wildcats earn the higher seed after a 1-0 victory earlier this season. It will also be a rematch of last year's first round game which the Highlanders won 4-3.

Stanford

The Cardinal will be the second seed at the NorPac Tournament and will earn a first round bye. They will play the winner of the 3/6 game between Pacific and Appalachian State.

The Conference Tournament will be held Nov. 2-4 at Ohio University in Athens, Ohio. The winner will travel to the home field of the NorPac's Tournament winner on Nov. 7.
