### PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

#### Co-Offensive

**Valentina Godfrid, Jr., For. California (Rosario, Argentina)**  
**Meredith Evans, Jr., For. Radford (Virginia Beach, Va.)**

Godfrid recorded another hat trick for the Bears, leading them to a 3-2 overtime victory over Stanford. Her final goal came just 24 seconds into overtime to give them the victory. She now has 25 goals and 61 points this season, ranking her second in the nation in both categories.

Evans registered two goals and two assists in games against Pacific and Stanford. She was instrumental in the Highlanders' 3-2 victory over the Tigers, netting a goal and assisting on RU's two others. She followed that with a goal against the Cardinal.

#### Defensive

**Kiera Gambeski, Jr., Mid. Radford (St. James, N.Y.)**

Gambeski tallied her sixth defensive save of the season and also recorded an assist in Radford's match against Stanford. She currently ranks third in the Conference and in the nation in defensive saves.

#### Rookie

**Caroline Hussey, Fr., For. Stanford (Houston, Texas)**

Hussey found the cage three times this week. She was key in Stanford's victory 3-2 over Radford, scoring two goals, including the eventual game-winner. She also had a goal in the Cardinal's match vs. Cal. She now leads all rookies with nine goals and 19 points, ranking third in the Conference in goals and tied for fourth in points.

**Around the NorPac**

**Appalachian State**

The Mountaineers concluded their regular season with a 4-0 victory over Catawba. Erica Muschamp tallied a goal and two assists and leads the team with five goals and 12 points. They will face Stanford in the first round of NorPac Tournament.

**Cal**

Cal claimed its seventh straight regular season title, tying with Pacific. They will be the No. 2 seed and have first round bye. The Bears will play the winner of the Stanford/Appalachian State game in the semifinals.

**Davidson**

Davidson, the fifth seed, will face Radford in the first round of the Tournament. They defeated Longwood and fell to Lock Haven in their final two games of the season.

**Longwood**

Longwood closed out its season with a pair of losses against Davidson and Lock Haven. Katie Murphy notched two more defensive saves to tie her teammate Shannon Ratte for the Conference lead with seven.

**Pacific**

Pacific claimed a share of the NorPac regular season championship, its first title. They will be the No. 1 seed at the NorPac Tournament and will face the winner of Radford/Davidson in the semifinals.

**Radford**

The Highlanders split their final two matches of the season with a victory over Pacific and a loss at Stanford. They will be the fourth seed and face Davidson in the first round of the Tournament.

**Stanford**

Stanford also split its final two matches, but the second, a victory over Radford, propelled them into the third seed at the Tournament. They will face Appalachian State in the first round of the Tournament.
